CAMP OCOEE 100TH ANNIVERSARY


In 1916, founders Glenn "Chick" Ellis and M.L. Mulkey got stranded by a flood. After hiking 200 miles, they stumbled upon the beauty of Parksville Lake and envisioned a Y camp. World War I delayed their plans, but Ellis returned, opening Camp Ocoee in 1923. Initially tent-based, the camp evolved to include buildings and diverse activities, going coed in 1967 and continually expanding. Today, Camp Ocoee offers year-round facilities such as Wasson Lodge and hosts approximately 1,200 summer campers and 4,000 yearly visitors. Renovations in 2023 included three new camper cabins, a new staff wellness center and upgrading the Ellis Dining Hall to be ADA accessible.


NEW YCAP SITE AT BRAINERD

The YCAP Brainerd site launched in the spring of 2023 as part of Chattanooga Mayor Tim Kelly's American Rescue Plan. The Brainerd YCAP serves students from Dalewood Middle, Woodmore Elementary and East Ridge Elementary. Over the last year and a half, the YCAP Brainerd site has served more than 60 kids. Our Brainerd YCAP site serves as a partnership with the City of Chattanooga located in the Chris L. Ramsey Community Center.

Henry Y is committed to youth development and offers programs centered around character development, healthy living, social connection, academic performance and food insecurity. The transformed J.A. Henry Y will include:

- Commercial kitchen for meal preparation to support 3 Y early learning centers and 80 summer meal sites
- Teaching kitchen focused on community nutrition education
